Postal History Presentations Slated for Stamp Shows

Denton, Neb. — April 8, 2013 — The Postal History Society offers stamp show attendees two free opportunities in the coming months to hear presentations on topics of interest. The first features a representative from the Philatelic Foundation speaking on “Fakes and Forgeries.” This talk comes during the society’s General Membership Meeting on Saturday, May 25, 2013, held in conjunction with NOJEX, the fiftieth annual stamp exhibition of the North New Jersey Federated Stamp Clubs, Inc., in Secaucus, New Jersey.

Looking a little further ahead, people with an interest in postal history can plan to attend the American Philatelic Society’s StampShow in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, August 8–11, 2013. During the Postal History Society’s General Membership Meeting, Dr. James Milgram will speak on the topic, “Advertised Postmarks on U.S. Stampless Covers.” The Postal History Society recognized his article on this topic as its journal’s Best Article in 2012. The society will host a booth at the show and will organize a no-host, Dutch-treat dinner on Friday evening. Interested individuals can get more information and reserve a spot by stopping by the organization’s booth at the show.

The Postal History Society extends an open invitation to anyone interested in postal history to join the organization. U.S. memberships are \$35 annually. Included in the members’ benefits is a subscription to the *Postal History Journal* as well as admission to all of the society’s membership meetings.

In conjunction with both of the upcoming General Membership Meetings, the Postal History Society’s board will meet. Its May meeting includes the selection of a new treasurer.
